MATERIALS ON HAND TO USE

- Flat marbles or 'gems' for 'water' or stepping stones
- Golf tees and marbles for tiny gazing balls
- Small sticks and pine needles for a broom
- Wire, steel or copper, shepherd's hooks or joining twigs
- Popsicle sticks for fences or furniture
- Stones for paths
- Clay for bricks
- Willow sticks for chairs and arbors
- Balsam wood for doors, benches and tables
- Christmas decor for houses, vehicles and fairies
- Tiny gravel for patios
- Larger gravel for stone walls or tiny house facades
- Moss, lichen for bushes and trees

OTHER HELPFUL TIPS

- Container will determine your design/theme
- Remember your container needs drainage
- If container has large holes, try lining it with coffee filters
- Potting soil
- Trowel or spoon to work soil
- Small plants try cutting slips from plants you already have
- Spray bottle to mist
- Corks, cans, bark
- Miniature decorations purchased, created from nature, found around house
