# Fall garden information

### Clearing your garden

Fall is an important time to lay the seeds of success for next year's garden. By taking some time to clean up your garden and tools and make a plan for nutrient management, you can save yourself time and energy next spring. Also consider ways to protect our local pollinators during your fall clean-up.



### Planting spring bulbs is easy

Spring-blooming bulbs like tulips, daffodils, crocus, grape hyacinth and snowdrops require the cold of winter to make them bloom next spring. Fall is the best time to plant them to prepare for a spring color

bonanza!

## Do you really need to rake all those leaves?

The real answer to this question is NO but it comes with a catch. Find out when you should remove the extra leaves in your yard.

### Collecting and storing seeds

Whether you are part of the MN SEED's Native Plant Community Science Project, contributing to a local seed library or just



storing from your own garden, fall is a good time for collecting seed in Minnesota from plants that are summer bloomers.

#### Fall lawn care

Fall is one of the best times to care for your lawn areas. From treating weeds to adding seeds, the cool weathers in the fall help your lawn plants get a head start for next year. However, the continuing drought conditions put even the best efforts at risk this year.

### Preparing your trees for winter

Taking a little time to <u>prepare your woody plants</u> in the fall can help ensure that your trees and shrubs - especially any new plants you added to your garden this year - get through the winter safely.



### Feeding birds could get pricey this year

The severe drought pummeling the West and the Great Plains is one key reason for an expected spike in the cost of popular bird foods.
