



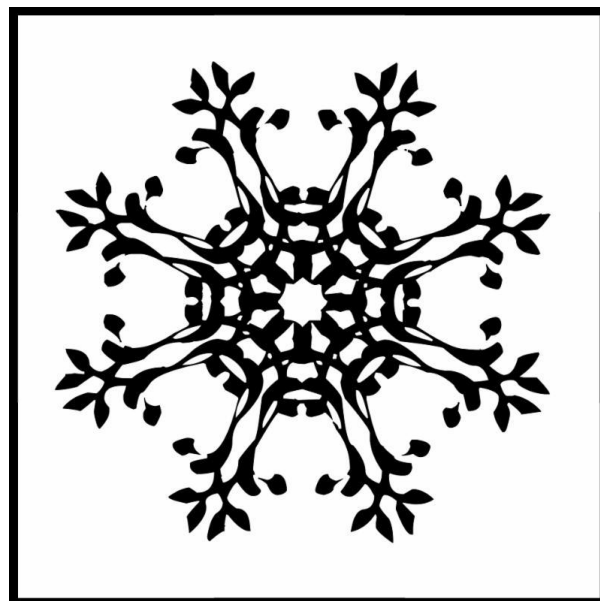

## Ramsey County Master Gardener Diagnostic Clinic

For many years, residents from Ramsey and Washington Counties have come to depend on our Master Gardeners' sage advice and University resources to tackle plant and pest problems in their yards and gardens. **The Diagnostic Clinic, located at 2020 White Bear Ave. in Maplewood,** is open to the public on Wednesdays and Saturdays from the beginning of May until the end of September.

In response to a growing membership and to encourage residents to use this resource even more, in 2018, we'll be offering extended clinic hours.

**For the month of May: Wednesdays and Saturdays, 11 am to 1 pm.**

**June, July and August: Wednesdays, 11 am to 1 pm AND 6 pm to 8 pm.**

**Saturdays, 9 am to 1 pm.**

**For the month of September: Wednesdays and Saturdays, 11 am to 1 pm.**

## Flowers for Pollinators

Ramsey County Master Gardeners are trained by the University of Minnesota Extension Master Gardener program to teach an innovative and thought-provoking class on Flowers for Pollinators. Many of our pollinators are in desperate need for flowers that are grown without neonicotinoids.

Neonicotinoids are a relatively new class of insecticides that affects the central nervous system of insects, resulting in paralysis and death. Commonly referred to as "neonics", they are systemic, taken up by the plants and don't wash off, so all parts of the plant contain the poison, including the pollen and nectar.

We'll challenge you to find a spot in your yard or on your patio or deck to plant some healthy flowers for these important creatures.
