

## ABOUT THE UNIVERSITY SEED TRIALS

Since 1982, hundreds of Master Gardener volunteers from across Minnesota have devotes time and space in their gardens to test popular vegetable and flower varieties.

Each year, volunteers grow six different vegetable crops, two different types of flowers, and sometimes an herb selected by the University of Minnesota's Extension program. Seeds includes both heirlooms and hybrid varieties, and focuses on varieties that promise high yield, ease of growing, space saving and simple beauty.

At the end of the year, the top-performing plants are identified based on the following criteria.

- Flavor
- Disease and insect tolerance
- Productivity
- Germination rate

The U of MN Extension maintains a running list of these top-performing Minnesota herbs, flowers, and vegetables.
